Excerpt from The Scientific Productivity of American Professional Psychologists Notwithstanding the limitations of value of individual Opinion, much might be gained by taking a consensus of Opinion of those of divergent special interests and of those who are admitted to be fair jurymen.¹ But we can also do something very definite by determining that a certain individual has or has not made any published contribution towards psychological advance.² This is a comparatively easy method giving positive results. It admits of little or no discussion of a judge's partiality, it rests solely upon the admission of published material as the facts with which to deal. We may also determine that one has contributed by books, or by the publications of investigations, or by any other means which we may select. And there is also the possibility of answering the question, Has the progress, as measured by the number of publications, corresponded with the number of individuals who have become professional psychologists?
